NEWSPAPERS

There are five large daily newspapers in San Francisco printed in English and a number in other languages, in addition to daily publications devoted to markets, court records, shipping and trade in general. Other publications include scores of weeklies and several monthly magazines.

LIBRARIES

The new Public Library, situated in the Civic Center, was erected at a cost of \$1,100,000, and was dedicated February 15, 1917. Other large libraries are the Mechanics' Institute and the Law Library, the latter being located in the City Hall.

CHINATOWN

Chinatown, the cryptic, is of great interest to visitors. It is the largest Oriental quarter in America, the Chinese population being close to 15,000. The main street is Grant avenue, along which are the bazars, gold-workers' establishments and drug stores. The teahouses, telephone exchange and markets are especially interesting. The showing of draperies, idols, carved ivory and other goods is rich and varied. Strangers may safely visit the district at any time.
